
Our Annual Appeal: Gifts Shared and Multiplied

Last year we came to you with an appeal for a new building. Your generous response joined by donations of labor and resources allowed us to open the second Las Vegas Catholic Worker Hospitality House. Tim Caves, a volunteer contractor, used his talents and care to create a beautiful, welcoming home for the homeless families in the Interfaith Hospitality Network program. This Hospitality House also includes a retreat space to gather, pray, reflect and deepen the spiritual life of the community.

We are anticipating many new developments this year. In early December 2003, a new person will join the community. For the first time in seventeen years the Catholic Worker will have five full-time community members. We are grateful for this opportunity to strengthen our Las Vegas witness and ministry together.

Last year a decision was made by the Franciscan Santa Barbara Province to move their Friars from Las Vegas to other locations in need, ending their 35 year presence in Las Vegas. After many years of working together with our Franciscan brothers we will greatly miss their presence. As a way to ease the impact of this loss the Province agreed to give their buildings to the Catholic Worker. Poverello House, Pace e Bene and Nevada Desert Experience, peace and justice projects established by the Friars during their years in Las Vegas, will be able to continue operating from these buildings.


